There are more opportunities than ever to work with children, so if you're the type of person who comes alive around young children, our NCFE/CACHE Level 1 Award in an Introduction to Early Years Settings can help you take your first step into a fantastic career.

Our next courses start on Friday 08 June 2018, Flitwick Football Centre; and Thursday 04 October 2018, Central Bedfordshire College, Leighton Buzzard Campus, from 9.30am to 12.30pm. You'll need to attend 1 session a week for 7 weeks.

To successfully complete the course, you will need to:

- Attend all 7 sessions from 09:30 to 12:30 – **08, 15, 22, 29 June & 06, 13, 20 July 2018, Flitwick Football Centre, Amphill Road, Flitwick, MK45 1BA; OR 04, 11, 18 October, 01, 08, 15, 22 November 2018, Central Bedfordshire College, Leighton Buzzard Campus, Chartmoor Road, Leighton Buzzard, LU7 4TN.**
- Participate in and discover how children learn from activities such as making playdough and creating treasure baskets
- Complete short written tasks set between each session
- Have access to a computer or laptop to facilitate online learning

Course fee is £25.00 but some applicants may be eligible for funding for this course, depending on individual circumstances at the time of application.

Limited funding to support childcare and/or travel costs may be available in certain cases, which will be subject to approval before confirmation of a place on the course. Please contact a member of The Academy team for further information.
