



CACHE Unit CYP0P6 Support Disabled Children and Young People and those with Specific Needs

What does the unit cover?

It covers topics such as the principles of working inclusively with families of children/ young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND); how to support age and developmentally appropriate learning, play or leisure opportunities; how to evaluate, support and develop existing practice and how to work in partnership with other agencies and professionals to support provision for disabled children and young people and those with specific requirements.

When can I start?

This is a self directed learning course - you can start anytime.

Who is it suitable for?

Workers who are working directly with SEND children/ young people and would like recognition for this important role. You will be working 1:1 or with SEND groups and may be involved in writing, implementing and evaluating SEND support plans and Education, Health & Care (EHC) plans.

What are the entry requirements?

You should be at least 16 years old and working directly with SEND children for a minimum of 7 hours per week.

How is it completed?

There is no teaching involved as this is self-directed learning through powerpoint. There is one visit by the assessor in the setting to check on the learner progress.

How long does it take to complete?

3 months.

What can I do next?

- Level 3 Diploma for the Early Years Workforce or other related Level 3 qualifications.
- Level 4 certificate for the Advanced Practitioner.
- Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Health and Social Care and Children and Young People's Settings.

How much does this qualification cost?
